POINTS OF INTEREST NEAR THE PRINCIPAL MADRID HOTEL

1 **El Prado Nacional Museum** 900m

The Museo Nacional del Prado is considered one of the most important painting museums in the world, as it houses extensive collections of paintings from European history between the Middle Ages and the beginning of the 20th century, with special emphasis on Spain. The bulk of its finest works come from the Spanish Royal Collection, assembled by Spanish monarchs between the 16th and 19th centuries. Collection of works of art from the 12th to the

19th centuries and masterpieces by Velázquez, Goya and El Greco.

2 **Thyssen-Bornemisza Nacional Museum** 600m

Museum that houses European masterpieces from the 13th to the 20th century, from the Renaissance to Pop Art. Once the most important private art collection in Europe, it was installed in Madrid rooms, with works of great value inside, including an armoury.

3 **Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía** 1400m

Spanish museum of 20th century and contemporary art. The museum's permanent collection includes a core of works by great Spanish artists of the 20th century, especially Pablo Picasso, Salvador Dalí and Joan Miró, who are widely represented with some of their best works.

4 **Palacio Real de Madrid** 1600m

An 18th-century palace with a balustrade offers guided tours of rooms filled with art and antiques. Madrid's Royal Palace is the largest in Europe, containing over 2000 rooms, with works of great value inside, including an armoury.

5

Sorolla Museum

1900m

Former studio house of the painter Joaquín Sorolla (1863-1923) which houses the painter's genre paintings.

6

National Archaeological Museum

900m

Neoclassical mansion with ancient and modern artefacts, including prehistoric art and Islamic pottery.

7

Gallery of the Royal Collections

A unique journey through centuries of history and art of the Spanish monarchy. Paintings, tapestries, carriages and extraordinary objects brought together in a contemporary museum next to the Royal Palace.

Palacio de Liria

1800m

In the Palacio de Liria you can experience the history of one of the most distinguished lineages of Spain through documents, paintings, sculptures, tapestries and other works of art that are preserved there.

9

Museum of Romanticism

900m

18th century palace with paintings and furniture from the Romantic period, plus a café in the garden.

10

Naval Museum

700m

Exhibitions on nautical science and the Spanish navy from the reign of the Catholic Monarchs to the present day.

11

Alzuela Gallery Madrid

A contemporary art gallery with a bright space that represents young, emerging, and established artists, both Spanish and international.

Galería Ehrhardt Flórez

Its goal: to bring the work of several post-war German artists to Spain. In recent years, they have also incorporated Portuguese art, offering visitors a journey through Europe's past and present.

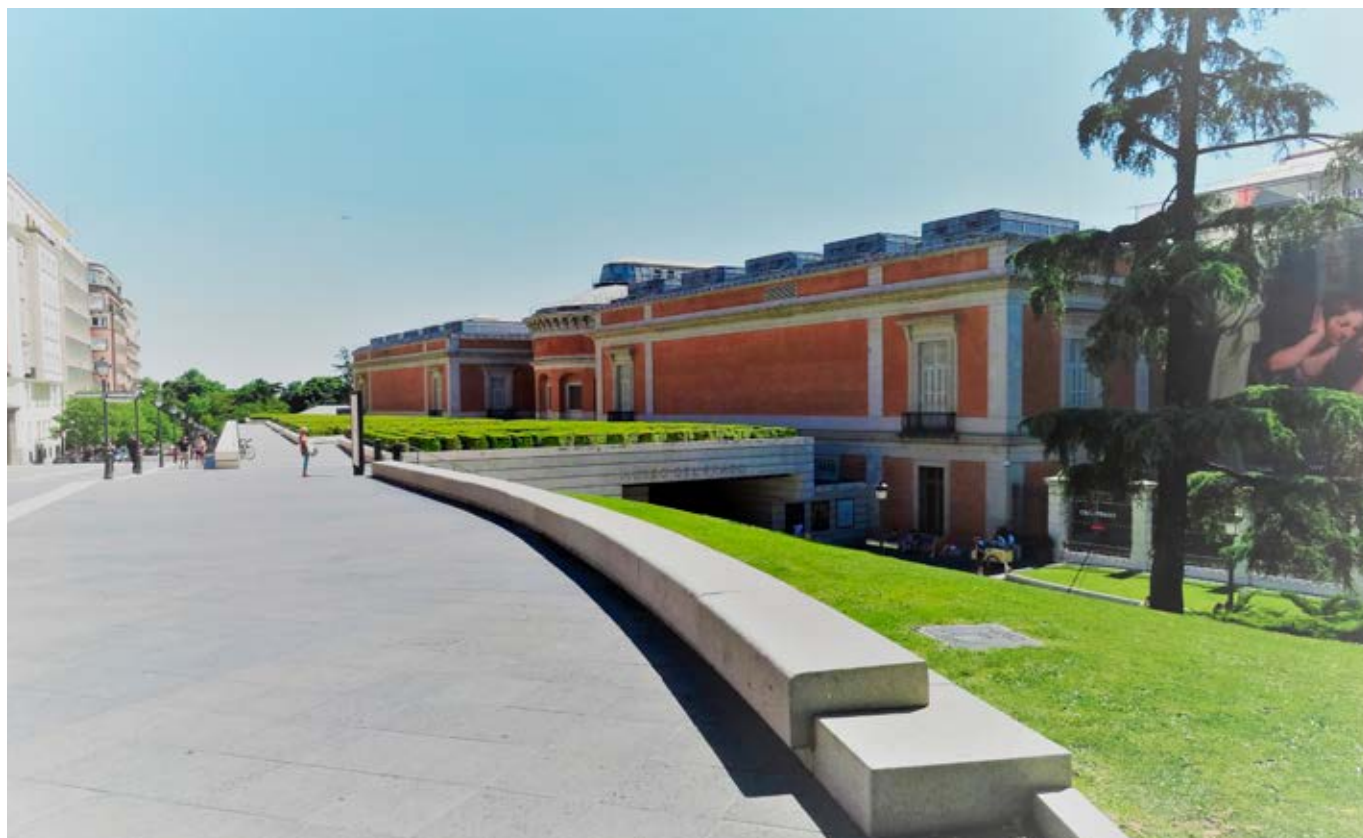

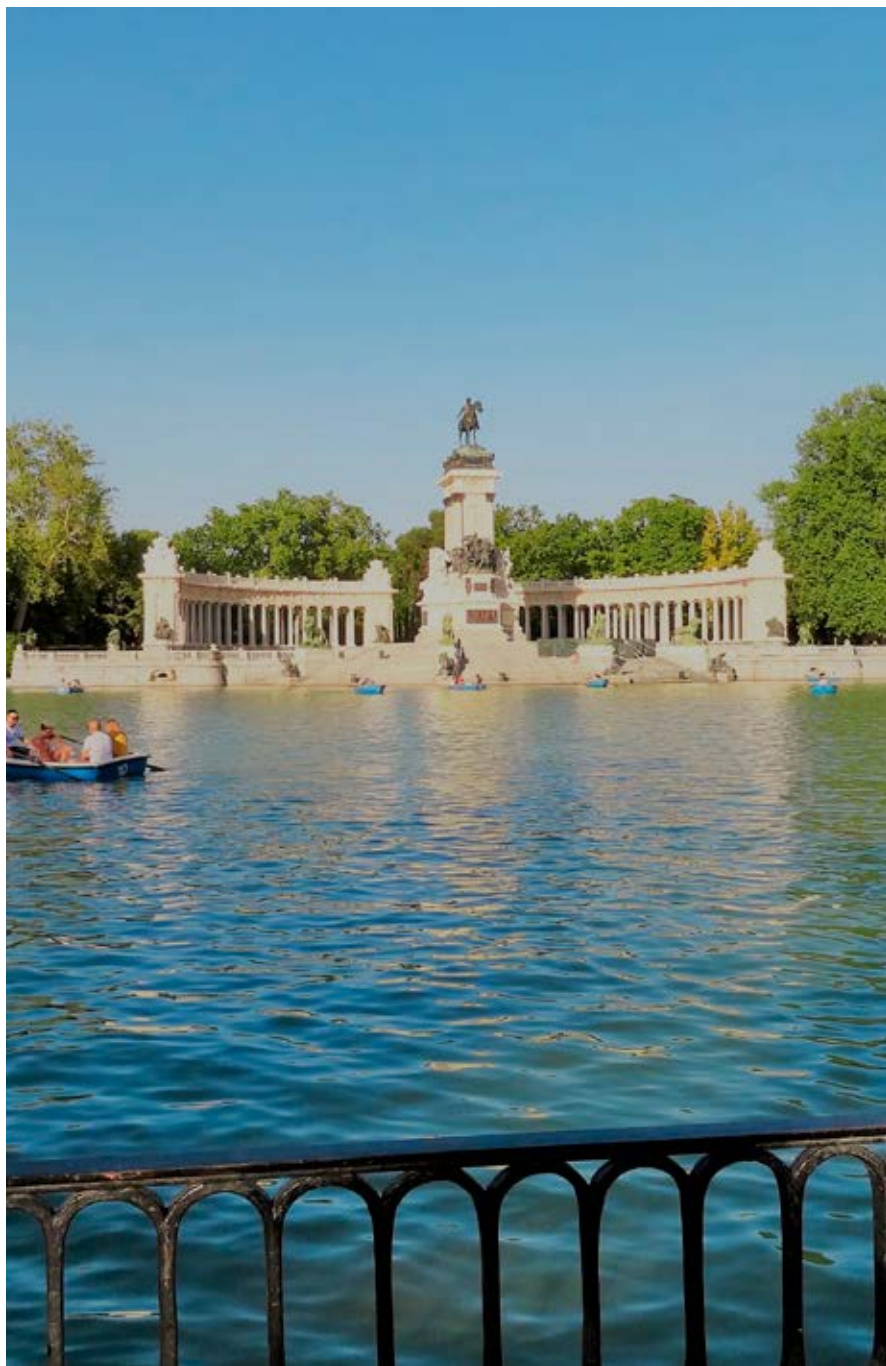

OTHER POINTS OF INTEREST

1

Puerta del Sol

700m

It is a square in the Spanish city of Madrid. Since 1950 it has been the location of the so-called Kilometre Zero of the country's radial roads. The oldest building in the Puerta del Sol is the Casa de Correos (Post Office) and it is

notable for its clock tower which was built and donated in the 19th century by José Rodríguez de Losada, and whose chimes at 12 midnight on 31 December mark the traditional eating of the twelve grapes for the vast majority of Spaniards.

2

Plaza Mayor

1000m

This arcaded square is the heart of Madrid de los Austrias, the old quarter of the city and the ideal starting point for a visit to one of the most charming neighbourhoods. It is fascinating to stroll through this square steeped in history, see the statue of Felipe III, taste the typical dishes of Madrid's gastronomy, and walk through the Arco de Cuchilleros, home to the oldest restaurant in the world according to the Guinness Book of Records, Casa Botín, founded in 1725.

3

Almudena Cathedral

1700m

It is certainly worth a visit, not only for the wonderful architectural ensemble it forms together with the Royal Palace, but also for its luminous neoclassical interior and the interesting neo-Romanesque Crypt, in front of which you can see vestiges of the city's Moorish wall. Nearby, just across the famous Viaducto de Segovia, you will find the Basilica of San Francisco El Grande, with a huge and beautiful dome, and paintings by the renowned painters Goya and Zurbarán.

4

Plaza de Oriente y jardines de Palacio

1400m

Between the Opera and the Palace is the Plaza de Oriente, a beautifully landscaped open space with the equestrian statue of Philip IV. It is one of the quietest places in the bustling centre of the capital. Next to the Royal Palace are the Sabatini Gardens and the Campo del Moro, two beautiful natural spaces in the palace style where admission is free.

5

Fountains of Cibeles and Neptune

600/800m

The Fountain of Cibeles, goddess of fertility on a chariot pulled by lions, in front of the Madrid City Hall, which is

located in the beautiful building of the Palace of Communications. The Fountain of Neptune, the Roman god of the seas, with the beautiful Church of San Jerónimo el Real in the background, and surrounded by two century-old hotels, the Ritz and the Palace, which is very close to the Congress of Deputies.

6

Puerta de Alcalá

1000m

The Puerta de Alcalá is the most famous of the ancient gates that gave access to the city, and which are still preserved in various parts of the city, along with the Puerta de Toledo and the Puerta de Hierro. It was the first triumphal arch built after the fall of the Roman Empire, which is why it is considered the precursor of others such as the Arc de Triomphe in Paris or the Brandenburg Gate in Berlin.

7

Retiro Park

1000m

Behind the gate, we find one of the lungs of Madrid, the Retiro Park, which will guarantee you a pleasant walk near the peaceful Palacio de Cristal, marvelling at one of the few statues in the world of the Fallen Angel, seeing an interesting exhibition in the Casa de Terneras or enjoying a boat in front of the Monument to Alfonso XII, where, by the way, many people gather on Sunday afternoons.

8

Templo de Debod

2100m

Near the impressive Plaza de España is the Templo de Debod, a temple from Ancient Egypt, which was a gift from Egypt to Spain as a thank you for helping to save temples such as Abu Simbel from being destroyed by the construction of the Aswan Dam. From there, you'll get beautiful views, and just two steps away you can use the cable car to get to the Casa de Campo.

9

Estadio Santiago Bernabéu

4100m

Starting from the Plaza de Colón and looking at the roofs and domes that will amaze you, passing by the sober buildings of the Nuevos Ministerios, until you reach the stadium. It is one of the most visited places in the city, due to the fact that the Real Madrid football club is internationally known, so many people take the opportunity to visit its museum and the cups won by the team.

10

El Rastro

1500m

Los domingos por la mañana las calles del centro histórico de Madrid, desde Tirso de Molina a Embajadores, se convierten en un divertido mercadillo callejero, el Rastro de Madrid, en el que además de encontrar multitud de objetos que comprar, podréis probar uno de los platos típicos de Madrid, los caracoles.

11

Plaza de toros de Las Ventas

3600m

Bullring in the neo-Mudejar style from the 1920s where bullfights, concerts and events are held. It is the largest bullring in Spain and the third largest

in the world. The Las Ventas bullring is a building considered to be an 'asset of cultural interest with the category of historic-artistic monument'.

12

Casa Mexico

A little piece of Mexico in Spain, where they seek to promote knowledge about cultural topics, business, entrepreneurship, tourism, gastronomy, and community development.

Galería Travesía Cuatro

A bridge between the Spanish art scene and Latin America. A place that champions initiatives where art offers a critical perspective on the current socio-political landscape.

GASTRONOMIC MARKETS

1 **Mercado de San Miguel**

1300m

Inaugurated in May 1916 as a food market, this centenary establishment (one of the few and best examples of iron architecture in the city) became the first gastronomic market in Madrid in May 2009. Located in the centre of Madrid de los Austrias and with more than 10 million visitors a year, the Mercado de San Miguel is the gastronomic temple of the city.

2 **Mercado de San Antón**

300m

In the heart of Chueca, this market is a box of surprises that is well worth a visit. The market has three floors. The first floor is dedicated to the sale of perishable products, the first floor is made up of a tavern-wine bar and ten show cooking / take away stalls and the third

floor houses the restaurant La Cocina de San Antón where you can eat the products previously purchased at the stalls on the first floor.

3 **Mercado de San Idelfonso**

750m

It is a new concept of leisure, enjoyment and socialising around gastronomy, in the style of the street food markets that can be found in London, New York, Singapore or Bangkok, and which has been designed as an authentic extension of the bustling and cosmopolitan Calle Fuen-carral where it is located.

4 **Mercado de La Paz**

1700m

Inaugurated in 1882, one of its peculiarities is that it was built with iron material. It is one of the most popular

markets in the Salamanca district and one of the most emblematic in the city.

5 **Mercado de la Cebada (**

1600m

This is one of the largest food markets in Madrid, with an area of more than 6000 square metres of commercial use in which food shops and other specialised establishments are distributed. It has a children's area, Cebada Kids, where every weekend activities related to healthy eating and fresh, seasonal products are organised.

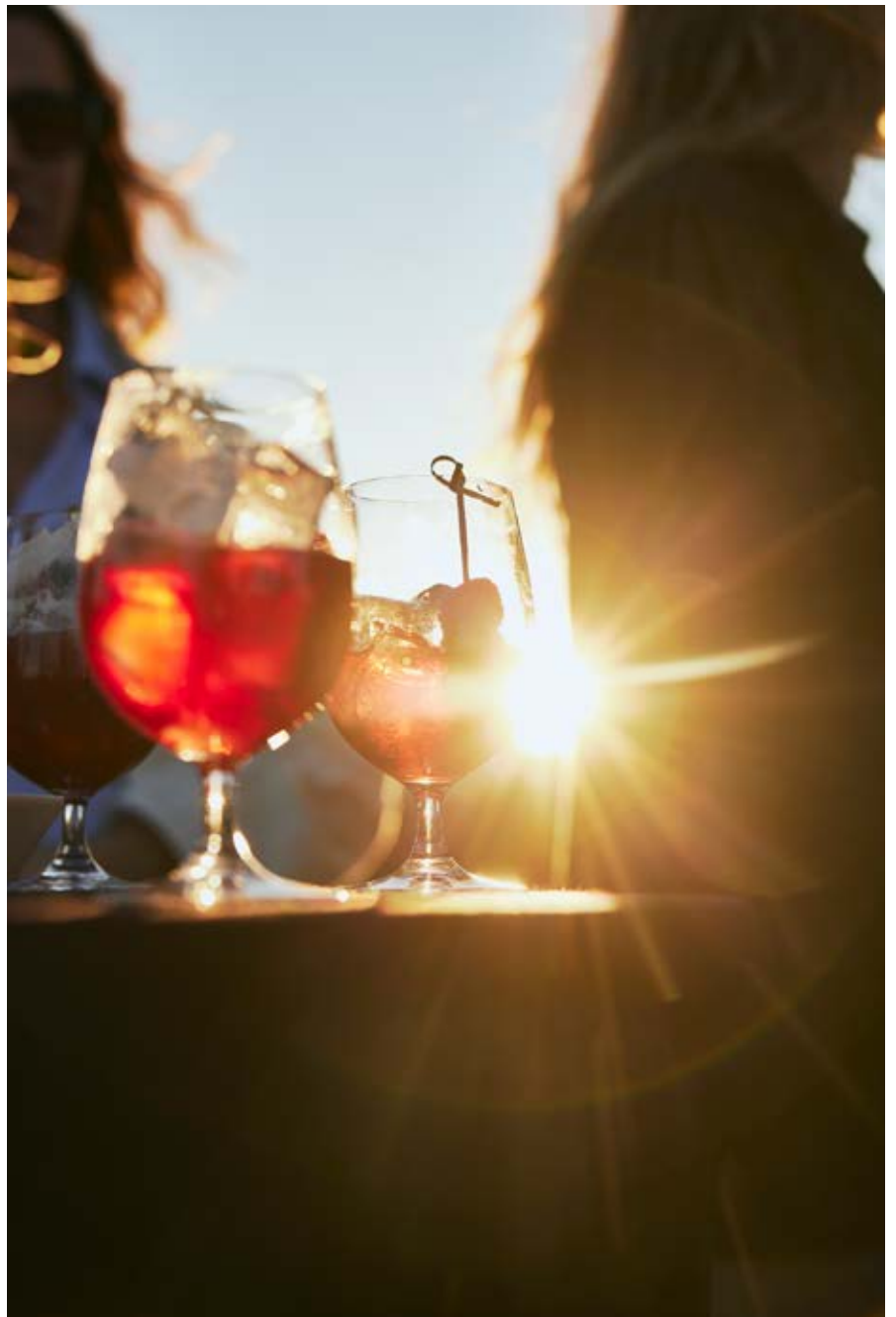
